Donald A. Prater, DVM Principal Deputy Director for Human Foods U.S. Food & Drug Administration



Dr. Donald A. Prater is the Principal Deputy Director for Human Foods. He previously was Acting Director of the FDA's Center for Food Safety and Applied Nutrition, a role he took on in 2023. As Acting Director, he adeptly helped lead the Center during a time of transition, prioritizing nutrition and the safety of the food supply, dietary supplements, and cosmetics while helping to re-envision the organization.

Since 2019, he had been the Associate Commissioner for Imported Food Safety in Office of Food Policy and Response, providing direction

to and management of imported food safety programs. In addition, he served as a senior scientific advisor and technical expert on matters related to human and animal food safety and the implementation of the FDA Food Safety Modernization Act. Earlier in his FDA tenure, Dr. Prater was Director of the FDA's Europe Office in Brussels, Belgium and the Department of Health and Human Services Country Representative to the European Union. Dr. Prater received a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine from the Virginia-Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine (government and corporate track) in 1996. Following a three-year residency in anatomic pathology, he joined the FDA's Center for Veterinary Medicine (CVM) in 1999 as a Veterinary Medical Officer. There he served in several roles including leader of the Aquaculture Drugs Team, CVM Pathologist, and Director of the Division of Scientific Support.

Angela Fields, MPH Senior Consumer Safety Officer for the CORE Network **U.S. Food and Drug Administration**



During her tenure at FDA, Angela has dedicated her career to implementing robust systems that safeguard consumers and enhance public health through the development and implementation of science-based policies, collaboration with internal and external stakeholders, and advancement of data-driven strategies to improve food safety outcomes. She In her role in CORE Response, Angela leads and supports multidisciplinary efforts to detect, respond to, and

prevent foodborne disease outbreaks providing epidemiologic, traceback and analytical data expertise related to outbreaks in support of FDA's response activities. Angela also serves as one of CORE's traceability subject matter experts to help promote harmonized traceability standards and best practices. She contributes on agency initiatives, to include policy and training development, policy implementation focused on enhancing supply chain transparency and traceability. Additionally, Angela supports educational and outreach initiatives aimed at increasing awareness and preparedness among industry partners, government agencies, and the public.
